

2020 Impact of Catch Up Premium

Allocation of funding 2019-2020 = £12,431

The number of students we supported was 70 with a Scaled Score below 98.

The split of students:

- 17 students below Scaled Score of 98 in Maths and English
- 29 students below Scaled Score of 98 in English
- 24 students below Scaled Score of 98 in Maths

What did we spend the Catch Up Premium on?

- Rapid Readers
- Specialist Dyslexia support (Units of Sound)
- Specialist Dyscalculia support
- Intensive Small group intervention in English and Maths
- Targeted use of TAs to support 'catch-up' students in lessons
- Small group literacy intervention
- Paired reading and guided reading through DEAR time

What effect has the expenditure had on the attainment of pupils at the school for whom it was allocated?

English - 66 % of students with a Scaled Score of less than 98 are on or above track.

Maths - 79% of students with a scaled score of less than 98 are on or above track.

English and Maths - 71% of students with a Scaled Score of less than 98 in both are on or above track

55% of students with a scaled score of less than 98 in English increased their Reading Age.

The average increase in Reading Age for students who came in at less than 98 Scaled Score was 14 months.

How we assessed the effect on attainment:

- Continual assessment in English and Maths
- Rapid Readers data
- Standardised Reading Age tests

Spending last year proved to be very successful and the following interventions will be continued through the academic year 2020-21:

- Specialist Dyslexia support (Units of Sound)
- Intensive Small group intervention in English and Maths
- Rapid Readers scheme
- Accelerated Reader
- More targeted use of TAs to support nurture and 'catch-up' students in mainstream lessons
- Paired reading and guided reading through DEAR time
